The "movement of natural persons" under the Japan-Philippines Economy Partnership Agreement (JPEPA) has posed various challenges to various sectors in both countries. However, these have not been addressed in a manner that will allow both the academic community and policy makers to suggest viable and effective solutions.

This seminar aims to provide a channel for policy makers, nursing specialists and social scientists to get together to discuss ways to ensure the effective implementation of JPEPA. Speakers from various academic disciplines such as nursing science, health sciences, historiography, migration studies and language education shall present their data and research findings.

JPEPA(日比経済連携協定)下での「自然人の移動」に関しては、双方の国にとって、それぞれに多くの課題があることは周知の事実である。しかし、両国の研究者と政策担当者が、建設的に解決策を議論する機会は、これまでにほとんどなかった。
